

Guidelines relating for Eligibility to play in the New Zealand Chinese Association Easter Tournament 2008

The Rule

Rule 6 of the rules governing the New Zealand Chinese Association (NZCA) Easter Tournament is as follows:

Persons eligible to participate in the Tournament are:

- a A Chinese person. A Chinese person being defined as a person of Chinese descent; or*
- b The spouse or the de facto partner (as defined by the Property Relations Act 1976) of a Chinese person; or*
- c The adopted child of a Chinese person or the adopted child of the spouse of a Chinese person; or*
- d The birth parent of a Chinese person or the parent who has legally adopted a Chinese person*

provided that person has lived as a permanent resident in New Zealand for a period of three months prior to the Tournament.

It is the responsibility of each Branch to ensure that each Sportsperson from their Branch is eligible to participate in the Tournament. If requested by the representative of a Branch participating in the Tournament the Tournament Controller shall require a Sportsperson to provide evidence of their eligibility. Failure to provide satisfactory proof shall deem that Sportsperson disqualified from participation.

Evidence of eligibility

To assist with the smooth administration of the tournament and deal with any questions or protests regarding eligibility through the tournament, the NZCA Easter Tournament Auckland Organising Committee respectfully reminds each Branch of their obligation to ensure each sportsperson is eligible for participation in accordance with Rule 6.

It is recommended that each Branch carry out investigations as appropriate, particularly on **players who are likely to be questioned**. Each Branch should then hold onto the written evidence so that it can be easily obtained in the event of a dispute or protest being made during the Tournament.

Should any protests be raised, the attached Statutory Declaration together with appropriate documentation will be accepted as proof of eligibility.

We realise that in some instances, evidence and documentation may not be readily available, please do your best to provide as much information as you can and seek any clarification necessary from the Tournament Controller (Yolande Joe)
