It was awesome to see how some people found relatives they had never known about. On the Sunday, because the officials don't work on Sundays we were taken to a cultural park. I really enjoyed going to Magnificent China and Minority Village Cultural Park. I learnt heaps about all the different minority villages, I saw all the different types of houses and costumes etc. I really liked the miniature China it was really neat, and interesting to see. We watched several shows, I loved the costumes, however the sound was abit loud at times though. I thought they were all really well done, from sound, lighting, stage set up everything was really well done and well worth watching.

On our first day in Guangzhou we were taken to the local memorial park to learn about the history of Guangzhou. I thought the memorial Park was nice although a little bit boring, however it was good to learn about the history of Guangzhou, the five Ram statue was interesting. The Chen Ancestral Temple was really big and really well maintained. I really enjoyed having a look at the model house, I saw the old-fashioned living room, art room etc it was all really interesting. On our last day we spent the day at the local

I found this city to be really beautiful with all the trees and flowers, we also heard all the love stories surrounding the lake which all ended in tragedy.

We then travelled further north visiting the Wuzhen Watertown where we went on small riverboats down the canal, which was fun. From there we continued towards Shanghai where we visited a history museum, more temples, went on a night cruise and watched an amazing acrobatic show.
